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WHAT IS HYDRO DEMOLITION?

Hydro demolition utilises the power of high pressure water jetting for the controlled removal and/or demolition of concrete. The vibration free process of hydro blasting removes the concrete leaving the steel reinforcement in place with no damage to adjacent areas.

Buxton Water Ltd specialise not only in manual hand lance hydro demolition, but also operate the largest UK based robotic fleet. Robotic hydro demolition opens up the opportunity for significantly increased rates of hydro demolition concrete removal compared to traditional hand lance methods, typically in excess of 5 times greater productivity with the added benefit of creating a safer working environment.

WHY USE HYDRO DEMOLITION?

- Vibration free eliminating HAV's risk for operators compared with percussuive tools
- Vibration free eliminates percussive noise transfer within a structure
- No damage of cracks to adjacent concrete
- Embedded steel is undamaged and cleaned
- Creates an excellent base to form a strong bond surface for new material

HAND LANCE HYDRO DEMOLITION



- Typical productivity based on 1 cubic metre per crew per day
- Ideally suited for smaller volume removal
- Ideally suited where access is restricted

ROBOTIC HYDRO DEMOLITION



- Typical productivity based on 5 cubic metres plus per crew per day
- Significant gains in Health & Safety with the operators being remote from the process
- Enables shorter working programmes
- Ideally suited for larger volume jobs
